<p>Did George Washington have children?</p> <p>Answer: No, he was the Father of Our County, but he wasn't really a father.</p>	<p>Who was the first president to be voted for by women?</p> <p>Answer: Warren G. Harding</p>
<p>Who was the first president to have electricity in the White House?</p> <p>Answer: The country's 23rd president Benjamin Harrison was in office when the White House was first wired for electricity.</p>	<p>Name a president that was left-handed?</p> <p>Answer: Presidents Bill Clinton, James A. Garfield, Herbert Hoover, Harry S. Truman, Gerald Ford, Ronald Reagan, George H.W. Bush</p>
<p>How long after leaving office do former presidents get protection from the U.S. Secret Service?</p> <p>Answer: In 1965, Congress authorized the Secret Service to protect presidents and their spouses for their lifetime, unless they decline the protection. Recently, Congress limited the protection to 10 years after leaving office. President Clinton, will be the last president to receive lifelong protection from the Secret Service.</p>	<p>Who was the only U.S. president to hold a patent on an invention?</p> <p>Answer: On May 22, 1849 Abraham Lincoln was granted U.S. Patent No. 6,469 "A Device for Buoying Vessels over Shoals."</p>

<p>Who was the president when the White House got its first car?</p> <p>Answer: In November of 1899, William McKinley became the first president to ride in an automobile.</p>	<p>Which president promised "a chicken in every pot"?</p> <p>Answer: During the presidential campaign of 1928, a circular published by the Republican Party claimed that if Herbert Hoover won there would be "a chicken in every pot and a car in every garage."</p>
<p>Which president had a swimming pool installed at the White House?</p> <p>Answer: The first swimming pool built at the White House was completed in 1933 by President Franklin D. Roosevelt. Roosevelt, who suffered from polio, built the pool in the West Wing so he could use it to help strengthen his upper body.</p>	<p>What does the "S" in Harry S. Truman stand for?</p> <p>Answer: Truman told reporters that they should not use a period after the S, because it didn't stand for anything.</p>
<p>Which U.S. president became a U.S. senator after leaving office?</p> <p>Answer: That distinction goes to the country's 17th president, Andrew Johnson. Johnson, who was a former representative, governor and senator from Tennessee, was impeached in 1869 for attempting to remove his disloyal Secretary of War without approval from the U.S. Senate. He returned to Tennessee and won a seat the U.S. Senate.</p>	<p>Which President purchased Alaska?</p> <p>Answer: President Andrew Johnson purchased Alaska from Russia in 1867.</p>
<p>Who was the first President to live in the White House?</p> <p>Answer: President John Adams.</p>	<p>Who was the first President who was the son of a President?</p> <p>Answer: The sixth President John Quincy Adams, son of the second President John Adams.</p>
<p>Which President was called the "Old Hickory"?</p> <p>Answer: President Andrew Jackson.</p>	<p>Who was the first President to die in office?</p> <p>Answer; The ninth President William Henry Harrison died a month after his inauguration of pneumonia.</p>

<p>Which President ordered the combat use of nuclear weapon?</p> <p>Answer: President Harry S. Truman ordered the dropping of Atom Bomb on Hiroshima and Nagasaki to force the Japanese Emperor to surrender unconditionally to end World War II.</p>		<p>Which President married while in office?</p> <p>Answer: The only President to be married in the White House was President Grover Cleveland.</p>
<p>Who was the only President to serve as President without being elected to either the presidency or the vice presidency?</p> <p>Answer: President Gerald Ford.</p>		<p>Who was the US President during World War I?</p> <p>Answer: The 28th President Woodrow Wilson.</p>
<p>Who was the US President during World War II?</p> <p>Answer: The 32nd President Franklin Delano Roosevelt till his death on 12 April 1945 and then the 33rd President Harry S. Truman.</p>		<p>Name one president that awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.</p> <p>Theodore Roosevelt, Woodrow Wilson, Jimmy Carter</p>
