

1. The patterns of beats in a piece of music.

2. The highness or lowness of a sound.

3. Shows what pitches should be flat or sharp throughout the piece of music.

4. A curved line that connects two notes of the same pitch and indicates that the sound should be held for the length of both notes.

5. Notes having a separate, crisp sound.
Marked with dots over or under them.

6. To sing or play until you reach the word fine (the end).

7. The tune; a series of pitches moving upward, downward, or staying the same

8. The sounding of two or more tones at the same time.

9. A symbol placed over a note to show that it is to be held longer than it normally lasts.

10. Several people singing or playing a single melody at the same time.
